

S&P Dow Jones Indices Announces Update to S&P Composite 1500 Market Cap Guidelines

NEW YORK, Dec. 7, 2020 /PRNewswire/ -- S&P Dow Jones Indices ("S&P DJI") is updating the market capitalization eligibility criteria for new additions to the S&P Composite 1500 Indices. Effective **December 8, 2020**, the size ranges will be updated as follows.

Unadjusted company market capitalization of: · US\$ 8.2 billion or more for the S&P 500 · US\$ 2.4 billion to US\$ 8.2 billion for the S&P MidCap 400 · US\$ 600 million to US\$ 2.4 billion for the S&P SmallCap 600	Unadjusted company market capitalization of: · US\$ 9.8 billion or more for the S&P 500 · US\$ 3.2 billion to US\$ 9.8 billion for the S&P MidCap 400 · US\$ 700 million to US\$ 3.2 billion for the S&P SmallCap 600

In consideration of overall market conditions, the Index Committee believes a minimum threshold of \$9.8 billion for the S&P 500 is appropriate. These ranges are reviewed quarterly and updated as needed to assure consistency with market conditions. A company meeting the unadjusted company market capitalization criteria is also required to have a security level float-adjusted market capitalization that is at least 50% of the respective index's unadjusted company level minimum market capitalization threshold.

As a reminder, the market capitalization eligibility criteria is for additions. The addition criteria are for addition to an index, not for continued membership. As a result, an index constituent that appears to violate criteria for addition to that index is not deleted unless ongoing conditions warrant an index change.
